Agriculture and Livelihoods

- **23,911** farmers trained in conservation agriculture and/or livestock management;
- **4,559** farmers trained in horticulture crop production;
- **7** sand abstraction systems rehabilitated;
- **3** irrigation schemes developed/rehabilitated;
- **73** farmers performed agricultural activities at developed/rehabilitated irrigation schemes;
- **1,058** farmers adopted improved small grain seeds;
- **55** agricultural input fairs facilitated;
- **22** agro- dealers and **12** input suppliers participated in input fairs;
- **4** dip tanks constructed/rehabilitated benefiting **5,768** livestock;
- **10** dams constructed/rehabilitated benefiting **16,958** livestock;
- **2,166** households benefited from asset vouchers;

Resilience

- **177** village saving and lending (VS&L) groups formed and strengthened;
- **\$164,854 USD equivalent** value of savings generated;
- **1,386** individuals participated in VS&L;
- **8,868** farmers trained in grazing land management;
- **3,239** community members participated in cash for assets work;
- **726** hectares of grazing land rehabilitated under cash/food for assets;
- **14** ward disaster risk reduction committees strengthened;
- **9,414** community members trained on identifying risk and mitigation strategies;

Health and Nutrition

- **6** health centers with rehabilitated water and sanitation facilities;
- **10,888** individuals trained on Healthy Harvest (promotion of a healthy nutritious plate);
- **10,697** individuals participated in cooking classes promoting nutritious locally available foods;
- **11,680** pregnant women received monthly rations of nutritious supplementary feeding;
- **16,699** children under the age of two years received monthly rations of nutritious supplementary feeding;
- **18,746** community members participated in care group activities;
- **4,369** individuals trained in participatory health and hygiene promotion;
- **1,410** households constructed hygiene facilities (including latrines);
