





## **Matabeleland North**

## **Agriculture and Livelihoods**

- 35,298 farmers trained in conservation agriculture and/or livestock management;
- **2,582** farmers trained in horticulture crop production;
- 13 sand abstraction systems rehabilitated;
- 6 irrigation schemes developed/rehabilitated;
- 181 farmers performed agricultural activities in developed/rehabilitated irrigation schemes;
- 3,811 farmers adopted improved small grain seeds;
- 27 agricultural input fairs facilitated;
- 8 agro-dealers and 12 input suppliers participated at input fairs;
- 29 dip tanks constructed/rehabilitated benefiting 49,702 livestock;
- 12 dams constructed/rehabilitated benefiting 6,811 livestock;
- 3,645 households benefited from asset vouchers;

## Resilience

- 299 village saving and lending (VS&L) groups formed and strengthened;
- 2,922 individuals participated in VS&L;
- **595,926 USD equivalent** value of savings generated;
- 9,152 farmers trained in grazing land management;
- **4,330** community members participated in cash for assets work;
- 440 hectares of grazing land rehabilitated under cash/food for assets;
- 19 ward disaster risk reduction committees strengthened;
- 9,692 community members trained on identifying risk and mitigation strategies;

## **Health and Nutrition**

- 8 health centers with rehabilitated water and sanitation facilities;
- 21,353 individuals trained on Healthy Harvest (promotion of a healthy nutritious plate);
- 19,066 individuals participated in cooking classes promoting nutritious, locally available foods;
- 28,814 pregnant women received monthly rations of nutritious supplementary feeding;
- **39,409** children under the age of two years received monthly rations of nutritious supplementary feeding;
- 32,813 community members participated in care group activities;
- 9.961 individuals trained in participatory health and hygiene promotion;
- **2,885** households constructed hygiene facilities (including latrines);
