## Matabeleland South

### Agriculture and Livelihoods

- **81,067** farmers trained in conservation agriculture and livestock management;
- **16,881** farmers trained in horticulture crop production;
- **33** sand abstraction systems rehabilitated;
- **13** irrigation schemes developed/rehabilitated;
- **375** farmers performed agricultural activities in developed/rehabilitated irrigation schemes;
- **5,980** farmers adopted improved small grain seeds;
- **186** agricultural input fairs facilitated;
- **48** agrodealers and **12** input suppliers participated in input fairs;
- **17** dip tanks constructed/rehabilitated benefiting **20,258** livestock;
- **36** dams constructed/rehabilitated benefiting **45,958** livestock;
- **8,879** households benefited from asset vouchers;

### Resilience

- **606** village saving and lending (VS&L) groups formed and strengthened;
- **5,485** individuals participated in VS&L;
- **\$884,446 USD equivalent** value of savings generated;
- **27,384** farmers trained in grazing land management;
- **11,101** community members participated in cash for assets work;
- **2,097** hectares of grazing land rehabilitated under cash/food for assets;
- **46** ward disaster risk reduction committees strengthened;
- **34,313** community members trained on identifying risk and mitigation strategies;

### Health and Nutrition

- **19** health centers with rehabilitated water and sanitation facilities;
- **40,907** individuals trained on Healthy Harvest (promotion of a healthy nutritious plate);
- **36,251** individuals participated in cooking classes promoting nutritious locally available foods;
- **55,963** pregnant women received monthly rations of nutritious supplementary feeding;
- **72,484** children under the age of two years received monthly rations of nutritious supplementary feeding;
- **69,840** community members participated in care group activities;
- **12,150** individuals trained in participatory health and hygiene promotion;
- **4,880** households constructed hygiene facilities (including latrines);
